Planting seeds around March 15th outside is a good time for your cool season veggies and flowers. Young plants started indoors may benefit from covering the first 2 weeks with a row cover.

***Can tolerate some frost**

Potatoes should be covered if a frost is expected. Plant them 10-12" deep. A row cover will help with quail eating your seeds, frost, and aphids.

Carson City's last frost is usually Memorial Day weekend; Douglas County's last frost is usually Carson Valley Days weekend; Dayton's last frost is around May 15th.
